What Is Easter Season?

Easter, or Resurrection Sunday, is the day Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus the Christ from the dead. The early church saw the resurrection as the central witness to a new act of God in history and the victory of God in vindicating Jesus as the Messiah. This event marks the faith confession of the early church and was the focal point for Christian worship, observed on the first day of each week since the first century (Acts 20:7). Easter, as an annual celebration of the Resurrection has been observed at least since the fourth century. Even in churches that traditionally do not observe the other historic seasons of the church year, Easter has occupied a central place as the high point of Christian worship. In the Christian church year, the two major cycles of seasons, Christmas and Easter, are far more than a single day of observance. Like Christmas, Easter itself is a period of time, rather than just a day. It is a seven-week season of the church year called **Eastertide**, the Great Fifty Days that begins at sundown the evening before Easter Sunday (the Easter Vigil) and lasts for six more Sundays until Pentecost Sunday.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter

It is so far from being true that [salvation by grace alone] makes us remiss in a pious and holy life, that on the contrary without it we would never do anything out of love to God, but only out of self-love or fear of damnation. The Great Omission

There is no mechanical solution to true spirituality or the Christian life. Anything that has the mark of the mechanical upon it is a mistake. It is not possible to say, read so many chapters of the Bible every day, and you will have this much sanctification (Christian growth). It is not possible to say, pray so long every day and you will have a certain amount of sanctification. It is not possible to add the two together and to say, you will have this big a piece of sanctification.... The Christian life, true spirituality, can never have a mechanical solution. The real solution is being cast up into the moment by moment, personal communion, with God himself; and letting Christ's truth flow through me through the agency of the Holy Spirit.

Confession of Sin and Declaration of our Need of Jesus Christ

Ted Wagner

Leader: Isaiah 6:1-5

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"

⁴ And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵ And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

People:

Holy and righteous God, we confess that like Isaiah, we are a people of unclean lips. But it is not only unclean lips we possess. We are people with unclean hands and unclean hearts. We have broken your law times without number, and are guilty of pride, unbelief, self-centeredness and idolatry. Affect our hearts with the severity of our sin and the glory of your righteousness as we now acknowledge our sins in your holy presence.

Why is Confession important? In the Light of God's perfection and greatness, we see our sin and brokenness, yet we can come before the Father in honesty and openness, confessing our sins and remembering His promise to forgive us, cleanse us, heal us, and bless our gathering in Jesus' name.

Guidelines for Reception of Communion

Communion, also called *The Lord's Supper* or the *Eucharist*, is the family meal of Christians. We invite all committed followers of Jesus Christ to partake of this sacrament: those who are baptized and connected to a congregation that proclaims the gospel, who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ. Baptized children are welcome to receive Communion when they have been confirmed in their faith. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

Confessing our Faith

The Apostles Creed (4th Century AD)

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit
and born of the virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
